

South Carolina State Symbols Scavenger Hunt

The answers to this scavenger hunt may at times be found in the Children's Garden.
Look hard - they may be in places that you would not expect.

1. This shell is quite common on the beaches of South Carolina, so it was designated the State Shell.

2. This tree is symbolic of the defeat of the British fleet by the American forces at a fort built on Sullivans Island.

3. The song of this bird may be interpreted as "tea – kettle, tea – kettle, tea – kettle" or "kettle – tea, kettle – tea, kettle – tea."

4. This flower is usually the first sign of spring both in its fragrance and color.

5. This stone has been widely used throughout the state for building and monument beautification.

6. This is a prized game bird. It lives in the deep woods and hardwood forest. They are only hunted during the spring.

7. This mammal is one of the greatest game animals in the United States. South Carolina has the longest hunting season for this animal in the US.

8. This bug has a special role in all forms of agriculture in helping to control harmful insects.

9. This is a pollinator in orchards and gardens. It can be found in woods, along rivers and streams, and in towns and cities all throughout the state of South Carolina.
